From Our Farm to Your Table - Brother Scott Wilson

Much of the country has been caught up in the "Farm to Table" movement as a way to get local homegrown foods to serve their families. Brother Scott Wilson #66 has put his spin on that slogan and markets some of his products under the label "From Our Farm to your Table."

Brother Wilson graduated from UW-Platteville in 1973 With a degree in Agricultural Technology with an emphasis in Animal Science. Scott went directly from Platteville back to his home

farm Wilson's Prairie View Farm just west of Burlington, Wisconsin in Walworth County. The farm was purchased by Scott's great-grandparents John and Jeannie Wilson in the 1870's. The Wilson's were first generation immigrants from Scotland along with their son Robert (Scott's grandfather) raised out 8,000 to 10,000 Western lambs annually.

Wilson's Prairie View Farm made a major change in the 1940's when Scott's father Ralph Wilson purchased his first Hampshire hogs. Ralph later added other breeds of hogs including Yorkshire, Landrace, Durocs and Crosses. Brother Wilson started in the hog business at a young age when his father sold him a litter of pigs for him to raise. At a time when disease caused many problems for pork producers Wilson's Prairie View Farm became one of the only Specific Pathogen Free (SPF) certified Hog operations in the State of Wisconsin meaning that Wilson's hogs are high health and rigorously tested to maintain the integrity of the herd. In 1980 Scott and his father formed a C-Corp and since then, Scott has purchased additional land to grow the farm up to 1,000 acres with 800 sows.

Diversity is one word that can describe Brother Wilson's success in the industry. Armed with the SPF certification, Wilson markets some of his hogs to pharmaceutical companies including Merck, Zoetis and Boehringer Ingelheim for drug research. Some of his animals find their way to medical schools for students to practice surgical techniques with liver and kidney transplants.

Looking for new ways to market his meat led Wilson to two new businesses. In 2003 Scott purchased the Elkhorn Locker Plant which he renamed "Wilson Farm Meats." In addition to the custom butchering, processing and packaging, Wilson Farm Meats includes a retail store where Wilson's Prairie View Farm Heritage pork is available for purchase.

The latest way Brother Wilson is marketing his meat products to the public is the opening of "Wilson's Whistle Stop" a restaurant in Elkhorn, Wisconsin. Wilson opened the restaurant in 2020 as another way of getting product from his farm to consumers.

Advisor Report

It has been a busy fall at UW-Platteville with campus increasingly alive with classes, events and athletics that were virtual or cancelled last academic year being back to a traditional on-campus experience. Homecoming was a beautiful day with the parade, tailgate style luncheon, football team victory and the annual lighting of the M. We are excited to share just a small taste of what is going on at the University with you.

One major building project was completed this summer, and another is ongoing. On August 27, we celebrated the official re-opening of Boebel Hall at a ribbon-cutting ceremony. The university's science building underwent a \$23.7 million state-funded renovation to improve, expand and update instructional laboratories, preparation and support space, undergraduate research space and a general assignment classroom. The renovations have enabled Boebel Hall to become a state-of-the-art science building that includes a Cadaver Lab, Microbiology Lab, Molecular/ Biotechnology Lab, Freshwater Lab and Environmental Science Lab. It was designed to intentionally provide a stimulating, comfortable learning environment for students and faculty to collaborate. Representations of the Driftless Area are incorporated throughout the design in spaces such as the atrium, which features the limestone and sandstone prevalent in the area, along with wood highlights throughout the building. Boebel Hall was originally built in 1976 and partially renovated in 2010. It is named after Leo Boebel, who served as dean of Arts and Sciences, a professor of biology, and director of the medical technology program.

On October 6, we celebrated the construction of the forthcoming Sesquicentennial Hall – UW-Platteville's newest state-of-the-art engineering building. The \$55 million Sesquicentennial Hall will adjoin Busby Hall of Engineering to create a 200,000-square-foot complex that supports interdisciplinary engineering and computer science. A massive innovation center, an accessible green roof, exposed building infrastructure, and several state-of-the-art teaching laboratories will make the building itself a learning tool and a national exemplar for transforming engineering education.

In the School of Agriculture (SOA), Agribusiness faculty member Dr. Lucie Kadjo was recognized by the Wisconsin Academic Advising Association for excellence in advising and received the 2021 WACADA Faculty Advisor Excellence Award. Dr. Pete Lammers, faculty member in Animal Science, is contributing on a \$10 million dollar research project funded by the USDA and led by Purdue University, to make midwestern agriculture more resilient by diversifying farms, marketing, and the agricultural landscape. Dr. Ryan Pralle, one of our AGR advisors, was recognized by the American Dairy Science Association (ADSA) with the Midwest ADSA Young Scholar Award. Dr. Tera Montgomery worked with students in the SOA to launch Pioneer Sweets this fall. This student-run business will sell ice cream that is produced on campus. Ice cream sales will begin through campus-based eateries and they will also be reaching out to businesses in Platteville and Dubuque for potential wholesale opportunities. We welcomed one new faculty member this fall, Dr. Zifan Wan. She earned her PhD in Food Science and Technology from Iowa State University and holds a Bachelor of Science in Food Science from Purdue University. Dr. Wan was hired under the Dairy Innovation Hub (DIH) initiative to conduct research in dairy food development and management. She previously was a post-doctoral researcher at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville.

At Pioneer Farm, the addition of two new Lely A5 Astronaut robot milkers was completed this past spring with operation beginning in June 2021. As part of the Dairy Innovation Hub (DIH) initiative, robotic milkers were installed in the Pioneer Farm Dairy Center to build capacity for educational, research and outreach activities related to DIH priorities.

Students on several competitive teams in the SOA excelled at national competitions this fall. The Dairy Judging team competed at the 2021 World Dairy Expo Intercollegiate contest and placed 4th overall in the team standings out of 15 teams. The University of Wisconsin-Platteville Collegiate Soils Team took first place in the 64th annual Region 3 Collegiate Soils Contest, held Oct. 5-8. The event was held in McLean and Tazewell counties in Illinois and was hosted by Illinois State University. By placing first overall, they qualified for the National Collegiate Soils Contest to be held in spring 2022 in Ohio. This marks the 23rd time that the UW-Platteville team has won the regional competition since it started competing in 1973. These are just a few examples of the outstanding efforts of our faculty, staff, and students.

SOA fall 2021 enrollment figures totaled 517 majors continuing a trend of declining enrollment at both the University and School level over the past several years. By major these enrollment figures include: Agribusiness (163 majors), Animal Science (147), Agricultural Education (62), Soil & Crop Science (58), Dairy Science (33), Environmental Horticulture (30), Reclamation, Environment and Conservation (21) and Ag Undecided (3). The 517 SOA majors include 184 male students and 333 female students.

This fall, brother Mike North was recognized as a College of BILSA Outstanding Alumni and was part of the Homecoming BILSA Alumni Open Forum where he shared his background and experience with faculty, staff and students. Brother North graduated in 1996 with a BS in Agribusiness. He founded Commodity Risk Management Group in 2014, the company that he would later merge with Rice Dairy to form ever.ag. North enjoys using his experience to educate producers and business professionals about the tools available for price protection and risk management.

The Beta Gamma undergraduates held Ag Fest in person again this fall and have been focused on recruitment of new brothers both in and outside the SOA. They were very involved during Homecoming week, winning the annual Keg Bowl football game with Farmhouse and brother Connor Brickley being selected as Homecoming King along with Homecoming Queen Mindy Smits of Sigma Alpha. The undergraduates have been connecting with the AGR Alumni Board and working on plans for the 50th Anniversary celebration to be held this spring on April 1-2.

We would like to thank the AGR Beta Gamma Alumni Board and all alumni who have assisted the chapter over the past year. We would also like to congratulate all those brothers graduating in December and we are looking forward to seeing everyone at the 50th Anniversary celebration.

Frank Friar Receives National Service to Agriculture Award



Frank Friar #114 has received the National Association of State Departments of Agriculture's (NASDA) 2021 James A. Graham award for his outstanding service to agricultural producers in Wisconsin. Friar is a financial consulting and farm transition specialist with the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection's (DATCP) Farm Center.

"Frank's knowledge and expertise have combined to improve the lives and farming operations of countless farm families over the course of his career," said DATCP Secretary-designee Randy Romanksi. "At a time in his life when most people would have retired to the golf course or fishing boat many years ago, Frank continues to serve farm families that contact the Wisconsin Farm Center for help each day. We are

proud to have him as part of the DATCP team."

Friar grew up on a small dairy farm in Grant County, Wis., earned a bachelor's and master's degree in agriculture between his time serving in the U.S. military, and worked for more than 30 years in agriculture lending. Since joining DATCP's Farm Center almost 14 years ago, he has helped guide hundreds of Wisconsin farmers through complex challenges.

Friar was recognized for his contribution to the industry during the NASDA annual conference t in Louisville, KY in September. NASDA is a nonpartisan, nonprofit association which represents the elected and appointed commissioners, secretaries, and directors of the departments of agriculture in all fifty states and four U.S. territories. NASDA's James A. Graham award is named in honor of North Carolina Commissioner of Agriculture James Allen Graham who served from 1964-2001.

North Receives Distinguished Alumni Award



Mike North #443 graduated from UW-Platteville in 1996, with a degree in agribusiness. He began his career in the futures industry with First Capitol Ag in Platteville. After nearly two decades there, he founded Commodity Risk Management Group in 2014, the company that he would later merge with Rice Dairy to form ever.ag. In 2021, ever.ag merged with Dairy.com to

broaden its offering to not only the dairy industry vertical but also grain and livestock producers and end users as well. His team of brokers and advisors leads production and processing clients in their efforts to construct marketing plans and margin management programs.

North enjoys using his experience to educate producers and business professionals about the tools available for price protection and risk management. He has been published in several agricultural periodicals; is a regular guest on several national programs, such as AgDay, RFDTV, and the U.S. Farm Report; can be heard frequently on several local and

national radio programs; served as a part-time lecturer at UW-Platteville; and is a featured speaker at programs across the country.

In 2008, North was elected to the board of directors of the Dairy Business Association, an organization which represents the dairy industry and its economic and environmental stake in Wisconsin. He now serves as its president. North has been honored as the 2006 Rising Star in Business for the Iowa, Illinois, and Wisconsin Tri-State Region, and in 2011 as the recipient of the UW-Platteville Outstanding Alumni Award. He is a strong supporter of the UW-Platteville Foundation and donates his time to speak to UW-Platteville classes and student organizations.

"I came to UW Platteville with only a vague idea of what I wanted to accomplish in life," said North. "I knew a variety of people that I had met in other arenas. However, I didn't know myself. UW-Platteville fostered a tremendous platform for higher education, but more importantly created an environment where I could learn who I was, what I did well, and how I could use that to better my life and the world around me. What took place in the classroom was second to none. What happened outside of it was life changing."

Chapter House Updates

Early in the year it became acutely aware to the alumni board that some major repairs and updates to the house were needed. We used \$25,000 from the Dennis Valstad gift and used addition funds from the house refinance. We established a budget of \$75,000 for the needed updates.

Projects selected and completed are as follows:

- · Replaced carpet in all bedrooms, library, and the lounge areas
- Carpet on the inside stairwell was replaced with rubber cleats and matching material for the landings. This will make the step coverings much more durable and easier to clean and maintain.
- All window coverings were replaced with more durable and easier to maintain products
- Furniture was replaced in the library, first and second floor lounges with commercial grade products
- Parking lot was replaced and the base for the lot was upgraded.

After house inspections by the board, we also realized there we lots of small repairs needed. Brother Frank Raupp runs a home inspection and remodeling business in Cuba City, brother Raupp agreed to help us with small repairs. We developed a list of thirty items that needed attention. Brother Raupp worked on the repairs over the course of the

summer and completed them in September. We are grateful for the excellent work that was completed, and the very generous rate brother Raupp gave us to do repairs. Our intentions will be to use Frank Raupp for repairs as needed.

A few take-aways from the 2021 updates are that the alumni board needs



to budget more money for repairs and updates and it is critical that we enlist the services of a professional to do repairs and some maintenance. We cannot rely solely on the undergraduates to do repairs and we cannot burden the advisors with this responsibility.

We look forward to showing off the repairs and updates at Founders Day in April 2022.

How to Join AGR Today

How do new members seek order in our fraternity? Although our process is unique, it is also quite simple. As you may know recruitment events are important in meeting potential new members. If individuals at these events wish to potentially join, we will host a Quality Control or QC Interview. We have a QC Board within our chapter that consist of our VNR- Membership Development, VNR- Recruitment, and a member from our Sophomore, Junior and Senior classes, as well as an advisor who is always present during these interviews. In these interviews we ask basic questions about their background in school, life, and interest in the area of agriculture. We are looking for individuals who have shown and will continue to demonstrate experience in leadership, teamwork and communication. Once the interview is done the QC Board discusses if we feel this potential member shall be brought forward to extend a bid to during our next meeting. If the chapter as a whole, after discussion, wishes to extend a bid to this individual the new member is welcomed with a bid. If the extended bid is accepted the individual will be initiated at the following meeting by the Chapter. As we all know, the process of initiation is solemn and sacred. Following initiation, the new initiate is given their big brother- an active member who is there for advice and serves as a mentor.

After initiation all new members go through our education program as well as complete all new member education modules on AGR Con-

nect. The modules educate our new members on the brotherhood, which Alpha Gamma Rho is founded on. They also must complete an interview book that consist of interviewing: all current members in the fraternity, all three advisors, members of two different sororities and two alumni. These interviews allow current members to get to know the new initiates on a deeper level and build bonds. Our education process consists of five quizzes and one final exam. Rush: The idea of a Rush process doesn't embrace building relationships and getting to know each other; rush was replaced with the term recruitment which focuses on a longer duration process giving time for potential new members and the chapter to get to know each other.
