ALUMNI REPORT:

Dear Brothers, as we enter our 23rd year as a chapter of Alpha Gamma Rho, many changes and challenges are happening, have happened, and will continue to happen. Change is sizable part of life and is necessary for growth and development.

The Platteville Campus itself has come of age; the landscape has matured, "Old Main is gone. (Yes! 10 vrs) and even some of your children at UW-Platteville as students; A somewhat startling, sobering event but yet reassuring. The college of Agriculture has undergone evaluation by the Board of Regents and has been reorganizing to fit the needs of the UW System. UW-Platteville, itself, is reorganizing and regrouping under a program called Focus 2000, again to meet the challenges and needs of the future. The thinking being it is better to act instead of reacting to situations that the University will be facing in the near future. Yes, downsizing and "lightening up the ship" has come to academia. Beta Gamma has felt the effect of the restructuring enrollment caps of the UW System. The College of Agriculture has a cap of approximately 400 students of which 280 or 70% are male. Gone are the days of 600 Ag Students with a larger percentage being male. Currently, the number of active members is lower than our history, but a larger percentage of available males are brothers. Thus in reality, the men are adjusting and meeting the challenges this situation warrants. At this time, I would like to remind all the Brothers of Beta Gamma of their fraternal responsibilities, and that is to the brothers yet to come. Jason Brown, active brother, will be traveling the state, recruiting students this summer and may be calling on you.

Please help him in any way possible lodging, meals, information, and above all - give of yourself. Thank you.

Greetings Fellow Alumni, As a newly elected Beta Gamma Director of the Board, I would like to take this opportunity to re-introduce myself. I am Brother Mark Winters and I graduated from school in May 1991. While in school, I maintained a very active role in the work of AGR. I held the offices of Membership Education, Alumni Relations, and Planning. I also have been a voting delegate at the last three National AGR Conventions and believe I possess a good understanding of many aspects of the fraternity that will allow me to contribute to both the alumni and actives. As a director, I have three primary initiatives: 1) to stimulate greater communications from the board to the alumni and from the actives to the alumni via more frequent Crescents, newsletters, and social gatherings 2) to serve as an alumni liaison to aid the active chapter in recruitment 3) and finally to work closely with the active chapter to more fully and efficiently implement the Brotherhood Program which is a system of membership education with checks and balances designed to initiate quality men more quickly into the fraternity. FOCUS 2000

The University has just completed a restructuring process called FOCUS 2000. Beginning in the Fall of 1994, the University will have only three colleges versus the present five college structure. There will no longer be the College of Agriculture, instead agriculture will be in the College of Business, Life Sciences, and Agriculture. Because the agricultural program was labeled as one of the four leading programs (along with engineering, criminal justice and middle level education) at Platteville, it will be called the School of Agriculture. All of the other programs within the College of Business, Life Sciences and Agriculture will be labeled as departments rather than schools.

All in all, I feel that the agriculture program has come out of this restructuring process stronger than before. Having biology and business classes to compliment the curriculum for agriculture students should prove to be beneficial.


