





Thus far, our year has been pretty successful. The two things which looked like they would be our biggest problems were resolved quite early. At summer retreat the decision was made to send a trial Housemother contract to Mrs. Alice Reinhold, thus ending our house mother shortage. As of this report our accounts receivable is also good. Our Homecoming preparations are in full swing, and it looks like we'll be right in the running and well within our budget. These are our pluses this semester.

On the minus side, our costs are rising rapidly. The house is getting to the point where maintenance costs are becoming significant, and although the Alumni do take care of major work, part of the cost will be passed to us in the form of rising rent. Also, at the National Convention in Lexington, it was decided to raise initiation fees ten dollars in January and ten more in June. This will bring the cost of initiation to \$160 in the fall of 1979. Unless we can make Alpha Gamma Rho more attractive financially, we may begin to have trouble with rush. The active chapter will try to help, but we as college students are already struggling to make it financially. We are going to need the continued and increased financial support of our alumni if we are going to keep Beta Gamma alive.

raise a certain amount of this \$600,000, Beta Gamma has recently went to work to try to solicit our amount for the new Headquarters. Brothers Dave Bohnhoff and Jeff Jarvis have volunteered to oversee the fund-raising project. For them to help Beta Gamma reach its goal it is important to have the help and guidance of you, our Alumni. Each Chapter has the potential to meet or exceed the minimal goal of: 1 Brother at \$5,000 or more, 3 Brothers at \$1,000 or more, 5 Brothers at \$500 or more, and 20 Brothers at \$100 or more.

With everyone working, the goal is in sight. It is just a matter of everyone getting out and talking it over and making the pledges of money. These pledges are spread out over a four year period so as to make it easier for everyone. If you have any further questions give the house a call or drop a letter to the national office. 
