NEW DEAN OF AGRICULTURE

Dr. Thomas Lindahl became the Dean of the College of Agriculture this summer. Dr. Lindahl was born and raised on a dairy farm in Kendall, Wisconsin. He received his Bachelor of Science degree in Agriculture and Education at UW-Madison in 1960 and received his Masters in Vocational Agriculture at University of Illinois in 1970. Lindahl then received his Ph.D in Agricultural Education at Iowa State in 1977. Dr. Lindahl taught Vo-Ag at Stockton, Illinois and Agribusiness at Highland College in Freeport, Illinois. He then took the job of Chair of Agriculture Division at Northeastern Iowa Technical College. Next, Lindahl became Vice Chancellor at the University of Minnesota, Waseca in 1983 and was promoted to Acting Chancellor in 1990.

Since starting Lindahl said he received a warm welcome from faculty and students and that the adjustment to Platteville was pretty easy. Lindahl also said it was like coming home since he has worked near the area. He stated he would like the Alumni to continue to support the college, to become active in Alumni organizations as well as their continued financial support.

We are glad Dr. Lindahl chose to come to Platteville and we welcome his presence. We feel the College of Ag will excel to new heights, especially with the support of AGR Alumni. If you would like to meet Dr. Lindahl, he will be at the College of Agriculture Alumni luncheon in Russell Hall after the Homecoming parade. 
