GREETINGS FROM ALUMNI BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Greetings to all Platteville AGR alumni and friends from myself and the alumni board of directors. I am happy to serve as the 1997-1998 alumni president and board member. For those of you who don't know me, I am a 1994 graduate and I work for a Civil Engineering firm from Chicago and I currently reside in Crystal Lake, IL.

During the past months, the board of directors have been working on implementing a revised administrative structure which is aimed at organizing functional committees which formulate recommendations for the board of directors to act upon. Dr. Robert Campbell, with the board of directors approval, has formed an Ad. Hoc. advisory council made up of a cross section of active alumni individuals. The council meets at the boards request to rationalize and make recommendations to assist the direction of the board. The administrative structure presented by the advisory council and adopted by the board or directors consists of 4 functional committees; Financial, Building and Grounds, Alumni Functions, and Active Chapter. Each committee will meet, formulate alternatives, and make recommendations to the board. I would also like to thank everyone who made monetary donations for a house improvement fund drive at the last annual meeting. The contributions have been set aside in a separate account until more funds are made available to initiate a windows, siding, and other rehabilitation projects. We will keep you posted on the progress.

It is also wonderful to see the active AGR alumni population grow to nearly 500 members. Imagine that nearly 500 men have lived at and utilized the chapter house at 845 West Madison. That is the house you resided in and imagine that many people having lived in your own home. One could also picture the wear and tear and the continuous maintenance. We are at a point where the house facility needs an overhaul. Unfortunately, funding for a project of any type is scarce. As alumni men of Alpha Gamma Rho, we need to adhere to our commitment "to make better men." We must provide our present and future active brothers with improved living conditions.

The reality is that we need money. I believe that it is every brothers committed responsibility to provide the Alpha Gamma Rho fraternity in Platteville with some type of monetary contribution. I sincerely thank those brothers who gave \$400.00 life time dues but, that is only accounts for a small percentage of the alumni body. The trend indicates that income in the form of contributions and annual dues continuously goes down. Consequently, the cost to maintain the alumni activities and property directly falls directly upon the men that are living at the house and the rental income they provide I am encouraging participation, involvement, and ideas from all alumni to get our financial commitment to our brothers on track.

Lastly, I would like to invite everyone to our annual meeting and banquet scheduled for March 28, 1998. The banquet will be held at the Platteville Country Club. I would also like to encourage anyone interested in being nominated for election to the alumni board. Please come forward and express your interest.

We would appreciate your response by December 1, 1997. Thank you for your time and dedication to our organization.





SAY HELLO TO OUR NEW COOK!




WHAT HAS THE ACTIVE CHAPTER BEEN DOING LATELY!
