AGR NATIONAL CONVENTION REPORT

The 65th AGR Convention was held from August 2nd to August 5th. I would like to thank Beta Gamma alumni for letting me represent them. The different AGR boards reported that the fraternity is financially stable. Delegates did vote to raise the initiation fee and semi-annual membership dues for the undergraduates. Education endowment is growing. I know Brother Ward is working with the national Home Office for Beta Gamma Chapter to setup a scholarship program to assist our undergraduates. The World War II museum was the site for Thursday evening activity. This included a light dinner, musical program with popular songs from the World War II era and self-guided tour of the museum.

Throughout the convention during meals different individual and chapter awards were given out. Friday morning undergraduates had an opportunity to attend Career Fair. Many different agriculture companies were represented. A speaker for the noon luncheon spoke on financial management and discussed how stressful it can be if you do not budget. Friday afternoon gave us the opportunity to attend one of four breakout sessions. I attended the session on how to engage alumni in networking and recruiting new members. My wife Judy was able to attend a luncheon with other women on the Steam Boat Natchez touring the New Orleans harbor. We had a recognition celebration for Phil Josephson retirement at the Mardi Gras World. This facility is where they develop and store the Mardi

Gras floats. Entertainment included a small Mardi Gras Parade including a band. In addition, each chapter joined the parade with flags and school colors. Phil served longer than any other fraternity CEO. Phil's new replacement is Rex Martin.

At Saturday's business meeting we had election of new board members and new Grand President. Wisconsin's own Bernie Staller is the new Grand President. The 2020 AGR National Convention will be held in Wisconsin. There was a round table discussion on Saturday as well. The panel discussed the Future of Greek System. The topic centered on tragic events on college campuses nationwide and Greek life is under great scrutiny. They addressed the current trends the Greek community is faced with and understand the necessary actions administrators need to take to maintain the integrity of their universities. This relates to the potential legal consequences when students compromise the guiding values of their organization. Again, Saturday afternoon we had breakout sessions that included Alumni Engagement, Brotherhood Program improvements, Recruitment and Chapter Financial Management.

Adviser Report

Brothers,

As we arrive in 2019 we wanted to update you on several things going on at the University, School of Agriculture (SOA) and chapter level. As advisors, we continue to work with the officer team and chapter to live out the promise and values of Alpha Gamma Rho. If you have not reviewed AGR's Promise and Values recently they can be found here: https://www.alphagammarho.org/agr-promise-and-values.

As part of the collaborative integration process, UW-Platteville welcomed UW-Platteville Baraboo Sauk County and UW-Platteville Richland on July 1, 2018. There has been plenty going on during the first year of integrating these two-year UW Colleges with UW-Platteville. The purpose of this restructuring was to keep campuses open and to expand access to higher education by leveraging the strength of our four-year institutions at a time when overall enrollment at UW Colleges are declining. If you are interested in learning more about the collaborative integration process, there is a webpage dedicated to this process on the UW-Platteville website. As it relates to agriculture, we are currently discussing an Associate of Science degree in agriculture being offered at the branch campuses.

On Oct. 6, UW-Platteville played its fourth annual "Celebrate Agriculture" football game against the UW River Falls Falcons. This year it coincided with homecoming festivities. Compeer Financial partnered with the School of Agriculture and Pioneer Athletic Department to bring awareness and celebrate Wisconsin's \$88 billion agriculture industry. A major gift from Quality Liquid Feeds (QLF) in Dodgeville, WI was presented as part of the weekend. QLF provided generous support to the Dairy Science Faculty Fund for recruitment and retention of high-quality dairy science faculty and the overall dairy science program.

The SOA will have three Short Term Faculty Led international educational programs during the winter term in January 2019. Faculty and students will be traveling to Spain, Thailand, and New Zealand. The Spain program will focus on vertical integration in agriculture and international trade. The Thailand program is titled: Tropical Shelter Medicine, Management, and Welfare: From Companion Animals to Elephants. The New Zealand program is titled: From the Midwest to Middle Earth: Agriculture and Society in New Zealand. Another short-term faculty led program is scheduled for May 2019 in Costa Rica. These are great learning and educational opportunities abroad for our students.

SOA Fall 2018 enrollment figures totaled 703 majors down from 773 in the fall of 2017. This continues a trend of declining enrollment the past few years after a decade of continued growth. By major these enrollment figures include: Agribusiness (233 majors), Animal Science (191), Soil & Crop Science (84), Agricultural Education (66), Dairy Science (57), Reclamation, Environment and Conservation (32), and Environmental Horticulture (40). The 703 SOA majors include 298 male students, 405 female students.

Dr. Julie Van Der Wilt is an Assistant Professor of Agribusiness in the School of Agriculture at the University of Wisconsin-Platteville. Julie joined the School of Agriculture in August of 2018 where she teaches agribusiness courses including agribusiness (AGBUS 1500) and agricultural finance (AGBUS 3420). A Wisconsin native, she received a B.S. degree in Finance from St. Cloud State University in Minnesota in 2007. Julie also received an M.B.A in Finance and International Business in 2011 and a D.B.A in Finance and Economics in 2018 from University of Wisconsin – Whitewater. Prior to coming to UW Platteville, Julie was a Lecturer at UW-Baraboo/Sauk County and UW-Richland in the Business Economics department

teaching Financial Accounting, Managerial Accounting, and Personal Finance.

The SOA is in the process of conducting a national search for an assistant professor in Agribusiness specializing in commodity marketing. This position will fill the vacancy left when Agribusiness professor, Annie Kinwa Muzinga, left UW-Platteville after 16 years to join the agriculture program at Morningside College in Sioux City, Iowa. The search and screen committee will be reviewing applications and interviewing candidates during spring 2019, the new candidate would begin their appointment in August 2019.

Undergraduates held another highly successful Ag Fest (pictured to the right) to welcome back faculty, staff and students in the SOA. Ag Fest was held in September and was a great kickoff to another academic year. It included guest speaker, Arlin Wonderlich, past Grand President of AGR, who
