Remembering Those Who Served

On November 11, 2022 UW Platteville dedicated a memorial to the twelve students and alumni who lost their lives serving their country in the Vietnam War. The memorial is located near the flag poles outside of Ullsvik Hall. Fortunately, there were no Beta Gamma alumni who were among the twelve but many alumni served their county during this time period. Following are some of their stories.



James Timm #7 - Brother Jim Timm started at the Wisconsin State University at Platteville (WSUP now UW-Platteville) in the fall of 1967 after graduation from Wisconsin Dells High School. He was a member of the Alpha Pledge Class in the Platteville Colony of Alpha Gamma Rho. His memories of AGR were the first house at 350 W Pine St and starting construction on the current house. Jim attended the 50th Anniversary last year and he enjoyed seeing old friends and took great pride to see what the fraternity has become. He graduated from WSUP in the Spring of 1971 with a degree in Agricultural Economics.

Jim's future was changed on December 1, 1969 when the first military draft lottery was held since World War II. He didn't have to wait very long as his birthday of April 24 was drawn second. Jim decided to be proactive instead of waiting for the military to decide his future Jim looked into his options. After talking to member of the Reedsburg National Guard Jim signed up for the National Guard. Jim's National Guard training took him to Fort Knox just

south of Louisville, Kentucky. Jim spent six years in the National Guard and was part of the 105th Cavalry Unit out of Reedsburg, Wisconsin. Jim feels fortunate that outside of training every year at Fort McCoy his unit was never called up.

After the military Jim went to work for a Co-op in the Wisconsin Dells which is now part of Provision Partners Cooperative. He also spent some time at a foundry nearby. Jim also raised pigs and beef on the family farm near the Dells. Now that he is trying to slow down, as he has 20 beef cows and finishes their calves.

Jim and his wife Madonna celebrated their 50th Wedding Anniversary on May 19th at Spring Brook in the Dells. They have two children and two grandchildren one of his grandchildren will be attending UW-Platteville. Their son is an engineer for Harley Davidson and their daughter works for the State of Minnesota. We thank Brother Jim Timm for his service.



Frank Friar #114 - Brother Francis (Frank) Friar enrolled at WSUP in 1965 after his graduation from Boscobel High School. Brother Friar received both his Bachelor's Degree and his Master's Degree in Ag Education in 1970. Frank was part of the group who started the Alpha Gamma Rho (AGR) Colony at WSUP in 1968. He remembers going to the bank with Dr. Campbell to get a loan secured in part by the National AGR to buy the house at 350 W. Pine St. Frank recalls the house came with all the furniture still in it from the previous owners they held a yard sale and used the proceeds to buy a TV on which they could get three channels.

Halfway through his studies for his Master's Degree Frank was drafted (this was before the draft lottery) after visiting with his local Draft Board they told him to finish his studies then report. In 1970 Frank reported for duty.

He did his basic training at Fort Campbell Kentucky. After basic training Frank took an 18-week course in food inspection near the Chicago Stockyards. He recalls the course was tough and that many did not pass. Frank did and became a Specialist 4th class and was sent to Fort Jackson in Columbia, South Carolina to prepare for overseas assignment. Frank's first overseas assignment was doing food inspections at the Baumholder, Germany Army Base. Brother Friar's job was to inspect food from all over the world before the Army shipped the food to U.S. Army bases in the area. Frank's wife Judy was able to join him in Germany and they lived off the base.

After Frank was discharged, he started teaching in Fennimore, Wisconsin. From Fennimore Frank taught at Riverland Community College in Austin, Minnesota. While at Riverland Frank was working on his doctorate through the University of Minnesota. He then he decided on a career change. For the next 30 years Frank worked for Farm Credit. After retirement from Farm Credit Frank agreed to help Wisconsin farmers with credit issues at Wisconsin's Department of Agriculture Trade and Consumer Protection's (DATCP) Farm Center. What was supposed to be a two-year job at DATCP turned into a 15-year career. Frank was honored for his work at the Farm Center by the National Association of State Departments of Agriculture in 2021 (see the December 2021 Crescent).

Frank and Judy were married in 1971 and have three children and seven grandchildren. They live in Baraboo, Wisconsin. Frank said he has been very fortunate he has never had a job that he didn't like. 2023 Beta Gamma Alumni Association Annual Meeting

The Annual Meeting of the Platteville Alumni Association of Alpha Gamma Rho was held on April 1st in Russell Hall on the UW-Platteville campus. 45 Alumni, Undergrads and Advisors were in attendance with two attending online.

President Michael Long #727 called the meeting to order and he gave a brief review of the past year. In addition to last year's successful 50th Anniversary Brother Long mentioned the awards Beta Gamma received at the National Convention (see the December 2022 Crescent). Long also talked about the investments made to the house which included the installation of air conditioning. Long thanked those alumni who have supported the scholarship funds that have been established. There is now over \$121,000 in these funds used to support making better men at 845 W Madison.

Treasurer Jordan Alf #685 reviewed the Profit and Loss statement and reported that the Alumni Association is in good financial condition.

Using the property values on the property tax statement Alf told those in attendance that our net worth is \$476,000.

David Heimerdinger, Ryan Pralle and Chuck Steiner the Chapter advisors reported on the State of UW-Platteville and the School of Agriculture (SOA). UW-Platteville is currently conducting a search for a new Chancellor and interviews are currently being conducted. A new engineering building, Sesquicentennial Hall, opened this year. The SOA has seen enrollment declines over the years and is now at 445 students compared to 836 in 2015. Animal Science is the major with the most students. The advisors reported that 70% of the current enrollment is female.

Undergrad Chapter Nobel Ruler Chad Achenbach reported that they expect to have 15 to 16 brothers living in the house next fall. Their new member efforts have paid off as they have 11 freshman and 10 sophomores. Chad reported that they are reaching out to non-School of Ag students as potential new members.

The two outgoing board members, and Chuck Miller #109 and Scott Laufenberg #224, were thanked for their service on the Alumni Association Board. Brother Kim Keesey #180 and Brother Kevin McArtor #280 were elected to three-year terms (see a separate article).

After the meeting a social was held at Steve's Pizza.

Beta Gamma Mentor Program



National Collegiate Crops Contests

Beta Gamma Brothers, Jay Long #864 and Jack Licthe #901, competed with the University of Wisconsin- Platteville Collegiate Crops Team this fall. The team competed at the 88th annual National American Royal Kansas City Collegiate Crops Contest and placed fourth. The team also placed third overall at the 93rd annual National Chicago Collegiate Crops Contest. Components of the contest include plant and seed identification, commercial grain grading, and seed analysis. Brother Long and Licthe practice twice a week for four hours. 
