Roundtree Hall Damaged by Fire

On Friday, April 10, 1987, Roundtree Hall was gutted by fire. The fire broke out at 12:30 a.m. Friday morning. Firemen from Platteville, Belmont and Cuba City assisted in helping fight the blaze for over four hours, and stayed at the scene for over 20 hours. The building still smoldered all day Friday into Friday night. By 10:00 a.m., over 1 million gallons of water had been used to fight the blaze. The fire was believed to have started in the rear of the building on the ground floor and quickly spread through the roof. The heat and electricity have both been turned off for many years. The exact cause had not been determined, and the investigation continues as of press time, although arson is the probable cause.

Roundtree Hall, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, is owned by Roundtree Hall Inc. The corporation purchased the hall from the city in 1984 for \$60,000 and were undergoing a feasibility study to determine its future use. The hall was sold by the university to the city in 1977 and occupied by the city in 1979. I'm sure that many of our alumni remember Roundtree Hall, they probably had class in it while they were here.

Nearly all of the second floor was damaged heavily, the bell tower and roof were destroyed. The outer walls, built of blue limestone, are structurally sound, according to Fire Chief Jack Reiter. The future of the hall remains uncertain at this time pending insurance settlements and investigation findings. No dollar amount has been set on the damage.

The 135 year old building was dedicated in 1868 by Ulysses S. Grant. It was the state's first Normal School for the training of teachers, and was named for John Roundtree, the city's founder. A historical marker for the Hall was erected in front of the Hall in 1985 by the state of Wisconsin.

When asked how much time the position involved Robin made this comparison, "Being state beef queen is like pledging Alpha Gamma Rho for 365 days."

The National Meat and Livestock Board, the WI Beef Industry Council, and Robin's advisor Nancy Thomas provides her with assistance and plenty of resources, but Robin says, "Most of my job is based on past experience and ingenuity." She has a solid beef background. She comes from a 100 head crossbred Angus cow-calf operations and a 600 head commercial feeder operation. She personally owns nine head of Chianina cross cattle. She showed cattle six out of her nine years in 4-H, and she professionally fitted cattle for one year.

Robin strongly believes in her cause to promote beef. "This world cannot get along without farmers. The beef industry has suffered bad press from researchers and doctors. Consumers are not sure who to believe and usually end by following the researcher's advice. Consumers need to be better educated so they know the truth about beef and how to better prepare beef."






