

Actives in Desert Storm





AGR EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Dear Brothers,

I hope the NEW YEAR finds you all well. At the present time we are trying to reactivate the AGREP program that Beta Gamma has sponsored in the past. It has now been five years since we have sponsored an AGREP student. I feel that the crisis in agriculture that brought an end to this program at our chapter has past. The purpose of this writing is to stimulate interest in the program and reacquaint you, the alumni with the purposes of the AGREP program.

BACKGROUND

The Alpha Gamma Rho Exchange Program was initiated and developed by the Northern Indiana AGR Alumni Association in 1978-79. It was initiated to provide educational and practical work experience to undergraduate AGRs while also providing a mission and an opportunity for fellowship for AGR Alumni.

PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM

- A) To extend and complement the education of AGR undergraduates.
- B) To provide practical work experience to AGR undergraduates.
- C) To provide summer employment to students who may not have a good employment market in their immediate locale.
- D) To provide the student with an opportunity to travel and experience a different lifestyle in a different area of the U.S.
- E) To provide a larger parameter of career contracts for the student's use upon graduation.
- F) To provide an opportunity for fellowship among AGRs across the country.
- G) To provide a mission for established Alumni Chapters.
- H) To provide the host with the opportunity to broaden his agricultural perspective in relating territorial advantages to those advantages of another area of the country.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF HOSTS


- 1) To provide an educational and practical work experience for the student.
- 2) To provide housing and compensation in the amount of \$250.00 per week for the student in return for the labor supplied by the student.
- 3) To coordinate with other hosts and/or other AGRs to provide opportunities and fellowship for the student.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF STUDENTS

- 1) To supply labor to the host and his operation.
- 2) To participate and have fellowship with other AGRs including undergraduates and alumni and to participate in other civic and social activities in order to make the summer experience both meaningful and educational for himself and the hosts.

We need host volunteers from mid May to the end of August. The typical stay at any one host is usually two weeks. 

Patricia Campbell

Mrs. Robert (Patricia M.) Campbell, 60, Platteville WI, died Friday, Jan. 25, 1991, at St. Mary's Hospital in Madison.

Funeral services where held Jan. 29, at 10 a.m. at St. Mary's Catholic Church. Fr. Steve Zuettler will officiate. Burial was at Calvary Cemetery.

She was born Nov. 27, 1930, in Madison, the daughter of Kenneth and Elizabeth Slaney Long. She graduated from St Benedict High School in College Town, Minn. She married James Flannigan in 1953. He died as a result of a plane crash during the Korean War. She married Robert Campbell on Oct. 4, 1958, in Belleville. They moved to Platteville in 1965 when he took a position in the ag industries department at UW-Platteville. He retired as a professor in that department last May.

She graduated from UW-Madison with a B.S. degree in education in 1960. She assisted in organizing the Grant County Chapter of Right To Life in 1972 and organized Pregnancy Helpline in 1985. She taught CCD classes at St. Mary's Parish, where she was also a member of the Alter Society. She was a member of the Faculty Wives of UW-Platteville.

Survivors include her husband, three sons, one daughter, two grandchildren, one brother, and one sister. Memorials may be given to the Grant County Chapter of Right to Life.

Pat was a former Rho-Mate advisor and was supportive of Dr. Campbell in founding Beta Gamma. Our sympathy goes out to Dr. Campbell and his family.

Charles DeNure

Charles DeNure, former Dean of the College of Agriculture died October 31, 1990. He was sixty seven years of age.

Dr. DeNure was born in Wiota in 1922. He attended UW-Madison, where he received his Master's and Doctorate degrees. In 1947, he married Mary Kindschi. Dr. DeNure joined the Platteville faculty in 1952, and was named the first Dean of the College of Agriculture in 1966. He

retained this position until he retired in 1983.

Dr. DeNure is survived by his wife, three sons, and two sisters. Anyone wishing to make memorials may do so to the C.L. DeNure Scholarship Fund through the UW-Platteville Alumni Association.
