
45th Founders Day with Sigma Alpha

Alumni President's Report

The 2016-17 school year has been eventful for both the Beta Gamma Alumni Association and the Undergrad Chapter. While the Undergrads will report on their activities let me update you on your Alumni Association.

The Annual Meeting of the Alumni Association was held on April 8, 2017. Jack Ellickson was elected to serve the remaining year of George Koerner's term Jack was also elected Secretary. Tim Keil was re-elected to a three-year term on the board. Jacob Leum was elected to his first term on the board. Treasurer John Elvekrog gave a very positive the financial report, noting that we have a positive cash flow and our net worth is increasing. John thanked those who have paid their alumni dues as collections are ahead of what we have budgeted for. John also reported that the Alumni Association was able to renegotiate the mortgage on the remodeling project for 7 years at 5.25%. The Alumni also decided at the Annual Meeting to hold a Founders Day Banquet every five years instead of having one every year so the next Founders Day Banquet will be in 2022 which will be the 50th Anniversary of Beta Gamma. In the years between the banquets the Alumni and Undergrads will have a cookout type activity after the Annual Meeting.

The house at 845 W. Madison remains the best fraternity or sorority house on the UW-Platteville campus. The Alumni bought 20 new dressers to replace ones that have outlived their useful life.

In the January 2017 Crescent I reported on the Strategic Planning session that the Alumni Board and the Undergrad Chapter participated in. Now we have to implement the plan that was developed. Included in the plan are action steps to be undertaken by Alumni. We are in the process of setting up committees to assist the Alumni Board to carry out the Strategic Plan. We are looking for Alumni to serve on the following committees to develop plans to:

- 1. Five Year Budget
- 2. House and Maintenance
- 3. Undergrad and Alumni Relationship
- 4. Contingency Plan and Address list
- 5. Scholarship Fund

Each committee will be chaired by an Alumni Board member and should not involve more than two or three meetings contact me if you're interested in serving on a committee.

The Beta Gamma Alumni Association will be a hole sponsor at the UW-Platteville College of Business, Industry, Life Science and Agriculture (BILSA) Golf Outing to be held on Friday, June 9th. Proceeds from the event will be used to award scholarships to BILSA majors.

Advisor Report

Brothers,

As another academic year rapidly comes to a close, the undergraduates are preparing for the end of semester projects and final exams. Recently several brothers volunteered to assist with Ag Day on the Farm and Ag Day on Campus. Hosted by Sigma Alpha and Collegiate Farm Bureau respectively, the undergraduates participated in both events, promoting the agricultural industry on campus and in the community.

Current Fall 2017 enrollment estimates for the college of Business, Industry, Life Science and Agriculture (BILSA) and the School of Agriculture are lower than last year. This comes after a long trend of increasing enrollment in the College of BILSA recognized by a 41 percent headcount growth since 2005. The new Dairy Science major has been a real success, with growing student numbers and significant financial support coming from business and industry, including Badgerland Financial, Organic Valley and Mound City Bank. This spring, we hosted the Dairy Science kickoff celebration at Pioneer Farm. The event was well attended and served as a platform for promoting and educating people about the new major.

UW-Platteville hosted the University of Wisconsin System Board of Regents meetings on April 6-7, the regents' first gathering at the university since 2011. "The Board of Regents hereby commends UW-Platteville for its informative presentations, forward-thinking spirit, and many continued contributions to the UW System and to the state of Wisconsin," Regent José Delgado read in a proclamation to close the meetings. Chancellor Dennis J. Shields made the university's presentation to the board, speaking on UW-Platteville's role as stewards of place. The chancellor reiterated his themes of the need to invest in student success, talent and infrastructure.

The regents gave approvals to two projects that directly benefit the university. The board approved the authority to construct the \$15.3 million Williams Fieldhouse Addition, Phase II project, which also includes creation of an outdoor, multi-sport, artificial turf field and an outdoor storage building. In addition, an articulation agreement between the university and UW Extension was given the go-ahead. That agreement calls for a collaborative online Bachelor of Science in applied computing degree-completion program.

This spring, the University of Wisconsin-Platteville received official notification that the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) reaffirmed its accreditation. This follows the submission of a comprehensive quality assurance report and a campus visit by a team of HLC peer reviewers last fall. We are extremely pleased to have our accreditation reaffirmed by the HLC," said UW-Platteville Chancellor Dennis J. Shields. "This process presented a valuable opportunity for introspection to ensure that we are continuously evaluating and improving our programs and services in order to provide the best student experience. Accreditation is a voluntary process of external review that evaluates colleges and universities to ensure they are providing high-quality education and services and continuously seek to improve. The five criteria the HLC uses to determine whether an institution will receive accreditation include 1) mission; 2) ethical and responsible conduct; 3) quality of resources and support for teaching and learning; 4) evaluation and

improvement of teaching and learning; and 5) resources, planning and institutional effectiveness. The comprehensive on-site evaluations occur on a ten-year cycle. UW-Platteville has been continuously accredited since 1951.

The May Commencement ceremony will be held on May 12-13, 2017 and consist of four different ceremonies. The School of Business and Graduate Studies will hold commencement the evening of Friday, May 12. The College of BILSA Commencement, excluding the School of Business, will be at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, May 13. The College of LAE and College of EMS will also hold commencement in the afternoon on Saturday, May 13.

If you like to golf or just want an excuse to get together with faculty, staff and alumni, the 12th Annual BILSA golf outing and social will be held on Friday, June 9th at the Platteville Country Club. Proceeds from the golf outing are used to fund the BILSA scholarship program for students. Alpha Gamma Rho Alumni annually sponsor a golf hole at the outing. In the School of Agriculture (SOA), Dr. Rami Reddy, professor of Agribusiness was elected to serve as Director of the SOA starting on July 1, 2017. Dr. Reddy will be serving a three-year term. He will replace Dr. Mike Compton, professor of Environmental Horticulture, who provided leadership in the role as Director of the SOA for the past nine years.

The 2017 officer team started the spring semester by sending three undergraduates to recruitment school and holding a strategic planning and goal setting workshop. Fourteen members attended the annual AGR Leadership Conference in Milwaukee, Wis. in February, bringing back many new ideas. Another successful Founder Day was held on Saturday, April 8, allowing the undergraduates to interact with alumni at the board meeting and evening banquet. We have several undergraduates who will be graduating and are excited about starting their careers in the agricultural industry.

As advisers, we continue to work with the undergraduates to live the promise and values of Alpha Gamma Rho. We wish everyone an enjoyable summer and look forward to seeing you at the BILSA golf outing, homecoming or other AGR related events.
