McKittrick Serves as State FFA President

Many brothers of Alpha Gamma Rho have also been involved with the Future Farmers of America. Beta Gamma is proud to have as one of our brothers, Thomas McKittrick, who has spent the past year serving as Wisconsin's State FFA President.

Brother McKittrick is from a 400 acre dairy farm near Viola, Wisconsin. Tom is the youngest of three children and the son of Arland and Dorothy McKittrick. His parents manage a fifty cow herd of

Registered Guernseys.

Brother McKittrick attended Kickapoo High School where he was very involved in school activities. He served as a class officer, participated in forensics, band, musicals, and class plays. Tom was also on the yearbook and newspaper staff and an honor student. His involvement in FFA in high school became a strong basis for his later duties as a state officer. He served as secretary and president and was also active on various committees and judging teams.

Tom's farming program while in high school consisted mainly of showing Guernsey cattle and also involved some judging. He was the recepient of numerous awards such as the Dekalb Award, Proficiency Awards and the State FFA Guernsey Award. He also received the President's State Leadership Award and the Tri-StateParticipation and Achievement Award.


After graduating in 1978, Tom enrolled at the University of Wisconsin River Falls. After his freshman year at River Falls, Brother McKittrick transferred to UW-Platteville, where he was initiated into Alpha Gamma Rho in the spring of 1980 as a member of the Psi pledge class. While attending Platteville during his sophomore year, Tom also served as the State FFA Secretary. His duties as secretary involved attending various workshops, conventions, and banquets.

Brother McKittrick was elected Wisconsin State FFA President in June of 1980 at the state convention in Green Lake. His position as president meant taking a year off from college in order to fulfill his

duties.

Tom's year as State FFA President has meant extensive traveling. He has been on the road for almost 200 days out of the past year. Brother McKittrick has attended numerous leadership conferences and workshops this past year while serving as

president. He attended the State Presidents Conference in Washington, D.C. last July, where all the State Presidents had a chance to meet with former President Jimmy Carter. After the conference in Washington, it was back to Wisconsin for the state fair and then east again for a National Institute in Pennsylvania.

Some of Brother McKittrick's duties as State FFA President have been to attend various judging contest, safety meetings and the National FFA Convention in Kansas City. Tom has spent much of this past spring attending numerous FFA banquets at high schools throughout the state. He has also spent some time working at the State FFA Office in Madison.

Many brothers of Alpha Gamma Rho have stated that one reason that they pledged the fraternity was the similarity that they noticed between Alpha Gamma Rho and FFA. When Tom was asked how he felt the two were related he replied, "Both organizations are deeply concerned with the future of agriculture and making sure that young people are going to be able to meet the challenges that they will face." He also added, "Both organizations have

that common bond of the interest in agriculture. Both are trying to build agricultural leaders. In other words, they are both organizations made up of people pursuing a career in agriculture working together as a whole to benefit each by developing better mental, moral, social and physical qualities along with leadersship, citizenship, character, scholarship, and cooperation."

Brother McKittrick's term as State FFA President will be ending soon as new officers are elected at the State FFA Convention this summer. Tom will be spending the rest of the summer working for the Richland County Extension Service. He will be returning to Platteville in the fall where he will complete his degree in Agricultural Education with a minor in

Journalism.

The brothers of Beta Gamma are proud of the job that Brother McKittrick has done as a state officer. He has done a great job of representing both FFA and Alpha Gamma Rho. Congratulations Tom




House Update

Liz Gunka - An Agribusiness major from Milwaukee, Liz has accepted a position with Ciba Geigy as a sales representative.


