They raise a dual purpose animal which is a Brown Swiss-Brahman cross. Antonio's father is a congressman of Honduras. Blanco, as a lot of us called him, has two sisters and one brother.


Antonio went to college for five years at the University of Honduras with excellent scholarship achievements. He studied agriculture in the two fields of Animal Science and Soils and Crops Science at the University of Honduras. After graduation, Blanco worked for the government in the field of ag mechanization for two years. Part of that time, he was an ag representative to Switzerland.

Antonio had heard of the possibility of furthering his education in the U.S. He decided to take the tests and he hoped for the best. Blanco succeeded with his tests and accepted the opportunity for the government to support his education in the U.S. Antonio was looking for a small school that offered a Masters program in Agricultural Mechanization. There weren't many schools that offered this degree. Platteville was chosen to fulfill Antonio's requirements.

Upon arriving in the United States, Antonio went to Indianapolis for seven months orientation to familiarize him with the English language. This was a difficult task for him and would be for anyone in a similar situation. He was put into an American atmosphere and learned English by speaking it. He arrived in Platteville by bus in January of 1981. One of the most familiar faces when Blanco got to Platteville was Bob Cotter who had ridden on the bus with Antonio from Madison. Antonio wanted to find out some information about the college at Platteville. Bob wanted to help, as is usual for Bob, and plans were made to get Antonio settled in.

The dorms were full and Alpha Gamma Rho had a vacant bed. Bob offered the bed to Antonio until he could find something different. The chapter offered it to him on a permanent basis. He eventually became one of our brothers.

Blanco felt that school at UW-Platteville wasn't as difficult as it was in the Honduras. In his country, you would check out textbooks at the library on a short term basis

just for reference. He felt the professors at the University of Honduras pushed students more for achievement than he observed in the U.S. He stressed that we have so many opportunities in this country that we take for granted. Antonio felt it helped him to have his brothers in his classes as they helped each other.

After arriving home, Antonio is planning on working for the government in some field of agriculture. He is grateful for the support he has received from his country and would like to repay his country with hard work and dedication. He also plans on getting married and farming on his own in the future.

Alpha Gamma Rho has held a special relationship with Antonio. He is very thankful for the friendships he saw grow during his stay in Platteville. He had to conform to many of our lifestyles. He often had to take a ribbing like the rest of us and sometimes even a well-intended kidney punch. It was difficult for Antonio to express in words about the wonderful experiences he has had and we had trouble saying goodbye to him. Antonio has been more than special and we sure will miss him.






I would like to take this time to congratulate all of the May graduates. I hope they are all adjusting to the real world after four hard years of school. Their leadership and friendship will be missed by


Little Louie


thing growing.




Graduating Rho-Mates




