Advisor Report

Brothers,

Another semester has ended and I write this letter as we are in the midst of a frigid cold snap across the Midwest. Classes resume for spring semester on Monday, January 22 so campus is quiet and most undergraduates are spending some time at home or working over winter break.

The fiscal year for UW-Platteville began on July 1 and it started Dr. Rami Reddy's tenure as Director of the School of Agriculture. Dr. Reddy is a professor of Agribusiness and had previously served as program director for Agribusiness. An India native, Reddy received a bachelor's degree in agriculture from Andhra Pradesh Agricultural University in India. He received a master's degree in international marketing from Nagarjuna University in India. Reddy also received an additional master's degree in marketing from Fort Hays State University and a Ph.D. in agricultural economics from Texas A&M University. He joined the UW-Platteville faculty in August 1999. Reddy served the state of Wisconsin as direct marketing specialist during the first ten years of his career.

Dr. Rami Reddy has set goals for fundraising and faculty and staff involvement in research and international experiences. His overall vision is to cultivate a culture of excellence and grow opportunities for students, faculty and staff in the School of Agriculture (SOA). He wants to build strong external relationships, broaden opportunities via international engagements, study abroad programs and bring more diversity. Rami replaces Dr. Mike Compton, who served in this role for nine years.

Undergraduates held another highly successful Ag. Fest to welcome back faculty, staff and students in the SOA. The event was a great kickoff to another academic year. It included guest speaker, Ben Huber, Energy Sales and Marketing Manager for Insight FS and AGR Beta Gamma Alum, who provided a great message focused on getting involved and taking advantage of opportunities presented to you. It also provided freshman and transfer students the opportunity to meet current faculty, staff and students in a casual environment. After the event, undergraduates gave tours of the chapter house and lawn games were available.

In the SOA, the dairy science major celebrated the completion of its first academic year. Ten students graduated with a dairy science major and total enrollment has already grown to over 60 students. On Oct. 14, UW-Platteville played its third annual "Celebrate Agriculture" football game against the UW Oshkosh Titans. Sponsorship was provided by Compeer Financial – a new cooperative formed as a result of the merger of Badgerland Financial, 1st Farm Credit Services and AgStar Financial Services – the School of Agriculture and Pioneer Athletic Department joined together to bring awareness and celebrate Wisconsin's \$88 billion agriculture industry. Vita Plus Corporation, a livestock feed production company headquartered in Madison, Wisconsin gave a gift of \$25,000 to benefit the Dairy Science faculty fund and was honored at the homecoming football game. We are in the planning stages for Pioneer Farm to host the Lafayette County Dairy Breakfast on June 9, 2018.

Fall 2017 enrollment figures totaled 773 majors down from 813 in the fall of 2016. By major these enrollment figures include: Agribusiness (270 majors), Animal Science (210), Soil & Crop Science (88), Agricultural Education (75), Dairy Science (63), Reclamation, Environment and Conservation (36), and Environmental Horticulture (31). The 773 SOA majors include 333 male students, 436 female students and 4 undeclared.

We are in the process of conducting a national search to fill an assistant professor position in Agribusiness specializing in Agribusiness marketing and management. The search and screen committee will be reviewing applications and interviewing candidates during spring 2018, the new candidate would begin their appointment in August 2018.

At the University level, UW System voted to integrate UW-Baraboo/ Sauk County and UW-Richland with UW-Platteville. The UW System restructuring plan will take place July 1, 2018, and was proposed to improve access to higher education. All UW Colleges are being merged with their nearest four-year institutions. On Saturday, Dec. 16, the UW-Platteville hosted the 199th commencement ceremony in the Williams Fieldhouse, with more than 750 candidates. The College of BILSA's ceremony included 262 undergraduate candidates.

We recently elected the new officer team for 2018 and undergraduates who had not previously served on the leadership team will be filling nine of the eleven positions. We will be holding a strategic planning session with the new officer team in late January to focus on goals for their individual officer positions and for the chapter.

David and I continue our efforts to assist the undergraduates in living up to the promise and values of AGR through recruitment, opportunities for professional development and community service. We would like to thank the AGR Beta Gamma Alumni Board and all alumni who have assisted the chapter over the past year.


Noble Ruler's Report
