Brother **Kevin McArtor #280** and his wife Denice, a former Rho-Mate, operate a busy and unique Agri-Tourism operation near Malta, Illinois. Jonamac Orchard is a three generational family apple orchard and pumpkin patch. Jonamac Orchard has been in operation since 1984 when Kevin's parents purchased the property. Kevin and Denice got involved in the early 90s and purchased the house and 2 acres next door where they have lived since 1996.

As the name suggests there are apple trees and apples at Jonamac. The orchard has 20,000 apple trees of many different varieties. Not one apple goes to waste. In addition to eating them you can get pies and other baked goods. Apple Cider Donuts are a favorite. Each weekend day during their open season they make around 1300 dozen donuts. For those people who are thirsty some of the apples that do not make the grade for eating are made into apple cider, hard cider and apple wines. Those apples that are left over Jonamac has shooting range with Apple Cannons. Jonamac also has a corn maze a pumpkin patch and many other opportunities for family fun. The gift shop well stocked with donuts, caramel apples, fudge, crafts and novelty items. The Cider House tasting room is also available to sample and purchase the hard cider and wine. Many visitors are from the Chicago area, being located about an hour away. Jonamac is open 17 weeks each Fall, beginning the 3rd week in August through Thanksgiving. Jonamac welcomes approximately 100,000 visitors each year and employs 150-200 part time employees.

Kevin knew he wanted to be an AGR before he started college. His cousin was an AGR at the University of Illinois. Kevin used to hunt with a friend near Apple River Illinois, this got him interested in northwest Illinois and UW- Platteville. While visiting Platteville with his parents they attended a luncheon at the AGR house. Kevin also recalls attending a AGR rush party while he was still in high school. Kevin majored in Ag Economics and is a member of the Alpha Delta pledge class. Kevin would go on to become Noble Ruler of Beta Gamma in 1985. Kevin and Denice continue to support Alpha Gamma Rho at Platteville in many ways. At the 50th Anniversary Celebration the donated some of their wine and hard cider to the silent auction. Kevin currently serves as treasurer of the Beta Gamma Alumni Association.

Denice grew up on a dairy and hog operation near Mineral Point, Wisconsin. After graduating from Mineral Point High School, she chose to further her education at UW-Platteville because it was close to home. She majored in Ag Business. She remembers being one of a few female students majoring in Agriculture. She is surprised how high the percentage of female students majoring in Agriculture is today. While at Platteville Denice became a Rho-Mate and was chosen President of the Rho-Mates.

After graduation Kevin went to work for Farm Credit in Dixon, Illinois. Two years later he and Denice started working at what is now the Resource Bank in Malta, Illinois. Kevin and Denice have two sons Max 31, and Jacob 29.







Advisor Report

I am pleased to share this advisor's report highlighting the continued growth, accomplishments, and progress of the AGR Beta Gamma Chapter. The fall semester has gone by quickly and the undergraduates have been committed to serving the university, community and recruiting new brothers in a variety of meaningful ways.

We strive to uphold the values of brother-hood, scholarship, leadership, and community service that define Alpha Gamma Rho. Membership remains strong, with 42 active undergraduate brothers representing a wide range of majors within the School of Agriculture, Engineering and beyond. Recruitment efforts this fall were highly successful, bringing in a new class of 13 dedicated young men eager to contribute to the chapter and the agricultural community.

Academics remain a top priority. The chapter's average GPA continues to rank among the top fraternities on campus, with several members earning Dean's List honors. Brothers are actively engaged in student organizations such as the Ag Ambassadors, Ag Business Club, Agronomy-Soil and Water Conservation Club, Block and Bridle, Collegiate Farm Bureau, Pioneer Dairy Club, and Interfraternity Council.

Service to others continues to be a central focus. This semester, the chapter hosted its annual Ag Fest in September, welcoming back School of Agriculture faculty, staff, students and alumni to kick off a new academic year. They have engaged in several campus and community events including Day on the Farm at Pioneer Farm, Homecoming events, Adopt a Highway roadside cleanup, food drives and assisting community members in need. The brothers collectively contribute hundreds of volunteer hours each year, demonstrating AGR's commitment to "Making Better Men" and serving our community.

The chapter house continues to serve as a hub for brotherhood and leadership development. Regular maintenance and improvements continue to be made possible through the support of our alumni and the hard work of the undergraduate members. We are especially grateful to the AGR alumni board and alum Frank Raupp for all the assistance with managing repairs, maintenance and upkeep of the house and grounds.

We deeply appreciate the continued involvement and support of our alumni board and network. Your mentorship, guidance, and financial contributions are critical to sustaining the success of the chapter. We encourage all alumni to visit the house when in Platteville and to participate in alumni events such as Ag Fest, Homecoming and Founders Day. In the School of Agriculture (SOA), we welcomed a new Assistant Professor of Dairy Business and Economic Development, Dr. Kelvin Amon. Dr. Amon holds a Ph.D. in Food and Resource Economics from the University of Florida. This is a new position, funded by the Dairy Innovation Hub, focused on improving on farm decision making and competitiveness for Wisconsin dairy producers. We also hired Amy Church as a lecturer in Agribusiness; she has significant industry experience and is teaching our Introduction to Ag Business and Agricultural Consulting and Sales courses. SOA enrollment this fall is 448 undergraduates, one less (449) than last year and up from the previous two years. Of the 448 SOA undergraduates, 123 (27%) are male and 325 (73%) are female. This highlights the continued trend of less male students and emphasizes the shift to recruiting quality men from across the university.

The Capitol Campaign - Continuing the Tradition of Excellence

The Beta Gamma Alumni board of directors has established the need for a capital campaign to maintain Beta Gamma AGR as the premier fraternity on the Platteville campus. As such, a fundraising committee has been established and they have been hard at work developing the logistics for this effort. The committee has been meeting every month since March 2025 and will continue to meet to see this effort to its completion.

The campaign will begin on February 1, 2026. The board of directors and the committee have identified a three-tiered approach for the campaign.

The three areas of emphasis are:

House Improvements \$200 K
 Scholarship \$200 K
 Mortgage/Debt Reduction \$100 K

This approach creates a capital campaign goal of \$500K. At the writing of this article, the fundraising committee members and members of the board of directors have already pledged \$73,000 to the campaign.

The Fundraising Committee has secured several options for those interested in making a tax-deductible gift. Gifts for mortgage relief are not tax-deductible but would do much in making our Beta Gamma Fraternity even more successful. Every brother will receive a letter of invitation to donate to the campaign in the spring of 2026. Please indicate in the memo section of your check which area of emphasis you would like to support with your gift.

The first area of emphasis of the fund-raising campaign is house im-

provements. Why raise money for the Beta Gamma House? The Beta Gamma chapter house is the heart of our organization Remodeling the fraternity house is especially important given that our last renovation was 15 years ago. Over time, high-use areas such as the bathrooms and basement have experienced significant wear and tear, impacting safety, sanitation, and overall functionality. By concentrating our fundraising efforts on these spaces, we can ensure they are modernized, safe, and comfortable for all members. By request from the undergraduates, we are also planning upgrades to laundry spaces and increasing study spaces. Upgrading these key areas will greatly enhance daily living conditions, promote good hygiene, and create a more welcoming environment. Investing in renovations for the most heavily used parts of the house will have a lasting positive impact on our fraternity's community, reputation, and ability to attract and retain members.

The second area of emphasis is scholarship. Please see Scott Laufenberg's report in this issue.

The third segment of the fundraising campaign is reducing the house debt. Currently, we have a loan balance of \$198,906 at Mound City Bank with just over 10 years remaining. Our loan is up for renewal in April 2026 with the interest rate going from 3.94% to over 6.25% on a 10-year loan. If we can pre-pay the debt by \$100,000 over the course of the fundraising campaign, the new monthly payments would make us debt free in 5 years. Here are the benefits of paying down the debt: (1) improved cashflow, (2) build savings to help cover rising maintenance costs, (3) reduces our expenses, (4) keep lease rates to the actives more competitive, and (5) earn interest on savings.
